**Lesson: Luke 15:11-32 The Prodigal Son**

<b>Sanctuary</b>	Family Worship
<b>Scripture Reading (Room 3)</b> Prep Question: relate to the story before reading Students locate in Bible - teachers assist, do not pre-find for them Teacher reads aloud & discusses along the way	Q: Have you ever thought you were being treated unfairly? How does that feel?  Passage: In this story Jesus tells, the older brother at the end of the story is going to feel like he has been treated unfairly. See if you agree or disagree with how he feels. Read Luke 15:11-32.
<b>Scripture Retelling (Room 2)</b> choose one retelling style	<b>From a Hat:</b> In Room 3 write all possible parts on paper, put each into a hat; kids draw or choose audience/greeter; proceed to Room 2 for retelling <b>Prop Style:</b> Teacher uses kids as props to retell <b>Story Circle:</b> Students give one piece of the story at a time in order
<b>Scripture Review:</b> Review Questions & 3 Words (or pictures) Each student writes 3 words that describe the reading & everyone shares. Share quickly and teach the kids how to wait their turn & listen to others	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. What did the younger son want from his dad?</li><li>2. Is it customary to demand your inheritance BEFORE your parents pass away?</li><li>3. What did the young man do with all that money?</li><li>4. What did he decide to do when his money was all gone?</li><li>5. Did he think his dad would be glad to see him? Why not?</li><li>6. Was his dad glad to see him? Why?</li><li>7. Was the older brother glad? Why not?</li></ol>
<b>Verse of the Day:</b> (pre-write on board in R.3) <b>Students fill in verse card &amp; write in notebooks</b> Always ask if anyone wants you to write it for them They can also highlight words, use different colors & illustrate in notebook (Teacher should also keep a notebook)	Luke 15:31-32 <i>Look, dear son, you have always stayed by me, and everything I have is yours. We had to <u>celebrate</u> this happy day. For your brother was dead and has come back to life! He was lost, but now he is found!</i>  Fact: Just like the Parable of the Lost Sheep and the Lost Coin... All of heaven <u>celebrates</u> when a sinner comes back to God!

<b>Sanctuary</b>	Family Worship
<b>Scripture Reading (Room 3)</b> Prep Question: relate to the story before reading Students locate in Bible - teachers assist, do not pre-find for them Teacher reads aloud & discusses along the way	Q: Have you ever broken something and it couldn't be fixed? How did you feel? Did you wish you could go back in time and undo it? How do we make up for something that we can't fix at all?  Passage: Jesus knows that we need to show other people mercy just as much as we need mercy. See if you can explain what this means after we read. Read Matthew 18:21-35.
<b>Scripture Retelling (Room 2)</b> choose one retelling style	<b>From a Hat:</b> In Room 3 write all possible parts on paper, put each into a hat; kids draw or choose audience/greeter; proceed to Room 2 for retelling <b>Prop Style:</b> Teacher uses kids as props to retell <b>Story Circle:</b> Students give one piece of the story at a time in order
<b>Scripture Review:</b> Review Questions & 3 Words (or pictures) Each student writes 3 words that describe the reading & everyone shares. Share quickly and teach the kids how to wait their turn & listen to others	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Do you think Jesus answered Peter's question the way Peter wanted his question answered?</li><li>2. What did the king do for the man who couldn't repay the million dollars he owed?</li><li>3. Was that same man kind to another man who owed him even less money than that?</li><li>4. What happened to the unforgiving man?</li><li>5. How does God feel about people who need forgiveness themselves refusing to forgive others?</li></ol>
<b>Verse of the Day:</b> (pre-write on board in R.3) <b>Students fill in verse card &amp; write in notebooks</b> Always ask if anyone wants you to write it for them They can also highlight words, use different colors & illustrate in notebook (Teacher should also keep a notebook)	Matthew 6:14-15 <i>If you <u>forgive</u> those who sin against you, your heavenly Father will <u>forgive</u> you. But if you refuse to <u>forgive</u> others, your Father will not <u>forgive</u> your sins.</i>  Fact: We must forgive others because God forgives us.
